Making ethical choices as a community in Christ

When I read newspaper opinion columns, I'm struck by how very ethical and moral people can come to opposite conclusions about what ought to be done in a particular situation, and I wonder why people with the same ethical values about human dignity and worth and honor don't come out with the same opinion. In other words, why do people of good will differ? All may agree on the ethical position that we should "Do good and avoid evil", but we have very different positions on what that looks like in practice. One of the reasons for those differences is that

Sermon series continues

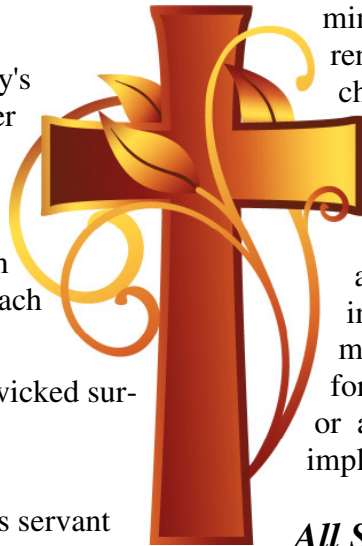

there's more than one method for arriving at an ethical decision. Some people make ethical decisions on the basis of absolute right and wrong as defined by rules and moral precepts. Other people make their ethical decisions based on what the outcome will be, and further refine their decision based on either "greatest good for the greatest number" or on "best for that individual in that moment" or on long range outcomes: an action that results in the best long term outcome.

And there are other nuances to these.

From the Pastor

The Church tries to make ethical decisions through community. It tries to form and nurture the character of its people as followers of Christ. The Church holds as fundamental that the moral nature of humans comes from our creation in the image of God. Because we are also by nature self centered, we recognize God's gifts of laws, rules and principles to defend us from our own human weakness. But God's Spirit acts in us to point us towards the future, reflecting our capacity for idealism and the desire to create a more humane social order. So in community we draw from the strengths of both systems to help us navigate between the desired goals and the means to them.

That's why the community gathers in prayer; that's why it lives in the tension between what is and what should be. Pray for the Church!

Day of service garnered more than \$8,000



Community Service Day: A Day of Service was called for by both the Governor of Virginia and Bishop Hanson (in honor of the 25th birthday of the ELCA) for September 14. To honor this call, Advent was a part of the community day of the churches on 23rd Street. At least four of our members distributed flyers in the neighborhood, and Advent volunteers served at each of the events from the pancake breakfast at Calvary and the restaurant sample lunch at the Church of the Latter Day Saints (which combined raised more than \$8,000 for the Capital Food Bank) to the ice cream social at Mt. Vernon Baptist and the concert of combined choirs hosted by Advent. A special thank you to all who took time on this beautiful day to assist!



Elections and “double dollars” on slate for the coming months

Elections for the Board of the Arlington Chapter of Thrivent will take place in November. If you are a Thrivent member (at either the associate or benefit level), you are eligible to run for a position on the Board. The time commitment is minimal – only four meetings a year. 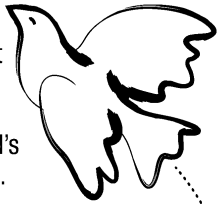

GROW IN Grace

Make this craft as a reminder to continue growing in God's amazing grace.



What you need:

- An adult to help
- Newspaper
- Acrylic paints
- Paper plate
- Paintbrush
- Small terra cotta pot and plate
- Cup of water
- Permanent black marker
- Potting soil
- Small "indoors" plant or packet of seeds

What you do:

1. Cover your work area with newspaper and squeeze paint onto the paper plate.
2. Paint designs on the pot and plate, cleaning your brush in the water when changing colors. Let dry.
3. With the black marker, write "Growing in God's Grace" along the top ridge of the pot.
4. Pour in a small amount of soil. Place your plant in the pot and surround it with more soil. (If planting seeds, follow packet instructions.)
5. Water your plant. Check it daily and keep the soil moist.
6. Enjoy watching your plant grow!
